With over 68 tours and activities, Ayers Rock Resort offers an impressive spectrum of internationally acclaimed experiences for guests in and around Uluru Kata Tjuta National Park. From the award-winning Sounds of Silence dining experience under the stars to the popular free daily Indigenous Guest Activities program there is something for everyone at Ayers Rock Resort.

Sounds of Silence

The award-winning Sounds of Silence dining experience begins with outback style canapés and chilled sparkling wine served atop a sand dune overlooking the Uluru Kata Tjuta National Park. As the sun sets and darkness falls to the sound of a didgeridoo, join a table of fellow travellers for an unforgettable dining experience and an introduction to Aboriginal culture with a traditional dance performance under the outback sky.

Guests help themselves to a bush-tucker inspired buffet that incorporates native bush ingredients such as crocodile, kangaroo, barramundi and quandong. After dinner, settle back and listen to our resident star talker decode the southern night sky. Locate the Southern Cross, the signs of the zodiac, the Milky Way, as well as planets and galaxies that are visible due to the exceptional clarity of the atmosphere.

Tali Wiru

Tali Wiru is a premium, intimate dining experience that combines Indigenous culture and the finest gastronomic fare. Instead of walls, this open-air restaurant has magnificent views of Uluru and the distant domes of Kata Tjuta, and for music there's the stillness of the desert at night. As shadows from the fire pit dance on the sand, stand with a glass of Champagne in hand, mesmerised by the sun setting across the desert. Limited to just 20 guests per evening, and only operating from April to October each year, it is a truly exclusive experience.

In the local Anangu language 'Tali Wiru' means beautiful dune. As the light fades guests are led to the peak of their own beautiful dune to begin an indulgent and delicious journey. The four course table d'hôte menu features creations such as native thyme and garlic grilled Wagyu fillet and wattle-seed rubbed kangaroo Carpaccio. Wines are selected from Australia's premier vineyards, an ideal complement to the unique Australian menu. After dinner a local storyteller captivates guests with celestial creation stories.

Field of Light, Uluru

Ayers Rock Resort's monumental art installation Field of Light, Uluru has received worldwide acclaim since opening on 1 April 2016 and a range of tours are available each evening, as well as a sunrise experience. The inspiration of internationally acclaimed artist Bruce Munro, Field of Light, Uluru's 50,000 glass spheres bloom as darkness falls over the spiritual heart of Australia. Pathways created by the artwork draw viewers into the installation, which



comes to life under a sky brilliant with stars and illuminates a remote desert area within sight of majestic Uluru. The installation is in place until 31 March 2017.

Desert Awakenings

Watch the amazing transformation of colours as the desert awakens pre-dawn with Uluru and Kata Tjuta as the backdrop. In the company of an expert guide and no more than 15 other guests, Desert Awakenings is designed to introduce guests to the natural and cultural landscapes of this remarkable region. Enjoy a traditional Aussie breakfast of bacon and egg rolls, tea, coffee and homemade damper with golden syrup in the open air and then, once the sun is up, enjoy a guided tour at the base of Uluru. The morning concludes with a visit to the Uluru -Kata Tjuta National Park Cultural Centre.

Free Daily Indigenous Activities Program

Learn about Anangu and Australian Indigenous culture and traditions by participating in the free daily activities organised by Ayers Rock Resort's Indigenous activities team. Enjoy a wide range of free activities, including guided or self-guided garden walks through local native gardens, join a bush yarn at the Circle of Sand with a local Aboriginal storyteller, support local artists and browse the many art pieces at the Indigenous art markets or marvel at traditional Indigenous dance and theatre performances.

Our Indigenous performers are traditional people with strong cultural obligations. In the event of some major unforeseen cultural event, such as ceremonial duties or bereavement, we may not be able to provide specified activities as advertised. Wet weather may also impact the location or time of the scheduled activity.

Outback Sky Journey's Astro Tour

Our resident astronomer will guide guests through the evolution of the Universe and a fact finding journey through the southern night sky. Explore the vast night landscape with the use of telescopes, binoculars and iPads. Learn how stars are formed, why they produce light, the lifecycle of a star, the theory of "the Big Bang" and much more.

Outback Sky Journey's Family Astro Tour

This family-friendly star gazing tour is designed for people of all ages. Learn how ancient cultures used the night sky for mythology, orientation and to predict upcoming seasons. Explore the night sky with telescopes, iPads and binoculars. Our resident astronomer will point out different constellations, stars and planets.

Maraku Arts Dot Painting Workshop

Maraku Arts Dot Painting Workshop provides a fun introduction to local Indigenous Art. Join Indigenous artists and learn about the different symbols depicting Creation Time (Tjukurpa) stories and make your own dot artwork. At the Indigenous Art Market on the Town Square Lawns see local artists at work and purchase an authentic piece of Anangu art or craft to take home.
